

SPIN-IT LEADERSHIP PROGRAM TO HOLD OPENING SESSION

A SPIN-IT Opening Session is scheduled for April 24, from 3:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m., in College Hall. The guest speaker will be Vivian Eveloff, Director of the Sue Shear Institute for Women in Public Life at the University of Missouri—St. Louis. SPIN-IT is a leadership program for Washington University in St. Louis women in IT, supported in part through funding from the Office of the Provost: Diversity and Inclusion Grants and IS&T.

It is designed to create a foundation for professional growth for current and prospective women employees who are pursuing or may pursue a career path in IT – a traditionally underrepresented career choice for women.

The SPIN-IT program includes a multi-tiered mentoring program that provides opportunities for growth and development for the diverse group of women participating in the program.

Mentoring is a partnership between two individuals, the mentor and the mentee, and is supported by job shadowing, small one-on-one conversations, peer-to-peer coaching, focus groups, and a speakers' series. Mentors and mentees were recently chosen after an application and screening process.
